1. Find the following derivatives:

$$\text{(i)} \quad \frac{d}{dx}(x^2 \sin x)$$

$$\text{(ii)} \quad \frac{d}{dx}(12 \arctan(-x))$$

$$\text{(iii)} \quad \frac{d}{dx}\left(\frac{\sqrt{x}}{1+x^4}\right)$$

$$\text{(iv)} \quad \frac{d}{dx} \sin\left(\frac{2}{x} + \frac{1-2x}{x^2}\right)$$

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- 2.** Use the definition of derivative

$$f'(x) = \lim_{x \rightarrow h} \frac{f(x + h) - f(x)}{h}$$

and the limit laws to compute $f'(x)$ when $f(x) = x^2$.

- 3.** Show that

$$\frac{d \arctan x}{dx} = \frac{1}{1 + x^2}$$

using the identity $(\sec x)^2 = 1 + (\tan x)^2$ and the fact that $\frac{d \tan x}{dx} = (\sec x)^2$.
